Key Accountabilities	Key Duties
Diagnosis, examination, and testing	Diagnose variety of eye conditions and abnormalities such as, glaucoma, color blindness, cataracts, and macular degeneration.
	Provide vision services such as examining, diagnosing and determining visual acuity, perception, focus, coordination, and other relevant eye imparities.
	Utilize Ophthalmic equipment, such as lensometers, pupilometers, binocular slit-lamps, and biomicroscopes for examining patient's eye conditions.
	Obtain patient's eye history information, prepare diagnostic reports, and update patient's files as needed.
Visual treatment and care	Refer patients when needed to ophthalmologist or relevant healthcare professionals if additional medical treatment is required.
	Identify eye conditions such as nearsightedness, farsightedness, and astigmatism through various tests.
	Assist the ophthalmologist in providing eye treatments such as vision therapy and low-vision rehabilitation.
	Educate and counsel patients on spectacles and contact lens care, eye hygiene, and vision safety features.
Supervision and eye education	Supervise and train new Optometrists, Opticians, and trainees, to minimize risks and errors in diagnosing patients.
	Stay up-to-date with new optometric technologies by attending trainings and conferences.
